


Phase 1 Kindy

These books are useful as they match the phase 2 sounds covered and are great to be used as phoneme spotters maybe enlarged in whole class teaching, independent or group activities.

All the Letters and Sounds resources have been collected from each year group and sorted into phases. They are now going to be kept in the storeroom in the blue area. If you take any resources, please return them when you are finished, there will be a sign in and sign out page. Due to the overlap of some phases in Year levels, it's important that we do this properly.



This box has a mixture of some Phase 2 and 3 resources. It consists mostly of flashcards and some dice with the different digraphs on them for games, tricky words and snap games.

These boxes are the Phase 2 letters and sounds boxes and are a mixture of useful games to use in phonics sessions and rotations etc.

The purple boxes are all of our Letters and Sounds Phase 3 boxes and have a mixture of:

- full set of flashcards in order of sets






We have a set of pocket rockets for Phase 3. These are great and a really useful resource. We have laminated each book so we can use them for rotations and ensure they last longer. There are 7 copies of each book which match the particular digraph/trigraph in order of the phase.



We have a set of Phase 3 books which cover each sound in the phase and can be used to sort sounds or identify sounds in words. These can often be used as part of a literacy rotation.



Phase 4



This box has a mixture of some Phase 4 and 5 resources. Mostly flashcards of words containing sound buttons (adjacent consonants), some scrabble letters to make words, sorting games, picture cards and matching word cards.

The green boxes are all our Letters and Sounds Phase 4 boxes and have a mixture of buried treasure, sentence substitution, yes/no cards, picture to word matching and matching pictures to captions.

We also have a box of flashcards with a bank of CVCC, CCVC words with sound buttons

The books are a similar format to phase 2 and 3 but cover aspects of phase 4: focusing on adjacent consonants, tricky words and blending and segmenting.



Phase 5



The pink boxes are all of our Letters and Sounds Phase 5 boxes and have a mixture of:

- buried treasure
- sentence substitution
 - yes/no cards
 - picture to word
- full set of flashcards containing words and sound buttons
- a box of words, which can be useful when covering alternative pronunciation in Phase 5.

Phase 6:

 Phase 6 focuses on turning children into fluent readers and accurate spellers by teaching them fundamental grammatical skills, such as verb tenses, suffixes, additional spelling rules and helpful spelling techniques. There are no new tricky words to teach children as they progress through phase 6 phonics.
