- Get a manual driver's license if you want to work in mining.
- Have an appropriate email address. Don't put your school email address if you are
 about to leave school. Also, <u>sexyguy@gmail.com</u> is not going to impress a potential
 employer.
- If you change your phone number, let the potential employer know by email and by ringing them.
- Dress neatly for interviews.
- It's ok to be nervous.
- Research the business you want to work for. If you want them to be interested in employing you, you need to show you are interested in working for them.
- Don't be afraid to ask for feedback. This will help you in your next application and if another job comes up with this employer, they may remember you. (Ask for two things you did well in your application and one thing you can improve on. Bev)

Unique Student Identifier



Students who have already been studying a VET subject will have a <u>Unique Student</u> <u>Identifier</u>. If you haven't got one and want to apply for Commonwealth assistance when you enrol at university next year you

will need a to apply for one. You need it to:



- Register for Commonwealth assistance (HECS-HELP, FEE-HELP, OS-HELP, SA-HELP)
- To receive your degree, certificate, diploma, certificate or record of achievement if you're graduating in 2023 or later

Your Unique Student Identifier will be used to maintain a record of your qualifications gained in Australia. It is recommended students create or find their USI via www.usi.gov.au before they need it to apply for financial assistance

The Federal government <u>Harvest initiative</u> also encourages job seekers to support the agriculture industry.




Applications Open for Murdoch Horizons Summer School
